profound impact on the institution's development both in terms of what enslaved people drew from these events and how their enslavers responded to them Throughout South Carolina's long history enslaved people never accepted their enslavement passively and regularly demonstrated their fundamental opposition to the institution by engaging in acts of resistance which ranged from vandalism to arson to escape and on rare occasions organizing collectively against their oppression Their attempts to subvert the institution in which they were held captive not only resulted in slaveowners tightening formal and informal mechanisms of control but also generated new forms of thinking about race and slavery among whites that eventually mutated into pro slavery ideology and the myth of southern exceptionalism <u>Domestic Landscapes of the Enslaved in the Caribbean James A.
