The text also examines how texts are abridged and transformed from publisher to publisher through close readings of The Wind in the Willows and Alice's Adventures in Wonderland and how the repackaging of works within a series highlight issues and choices tied to key paratextual elements Analysing data through distant reading and close reading of series from Ladybird Longman Puffin and Walker Illustrated editions this book sheds light on how modern classics series are marked by variation and instability but also a reductive homogeneity Through her use of quantitative and text focused research Webster reveals how commercial motivations have
