Homotopy Theory of Diagrams Wojciech Chachólski, Jérôme Scherer, 2002 In this paper the authors develop homotopy theoretical methods for studying diagrams In particular they explain how to construct homotopy colimits and limits in an arbitrary model category The key concept introduced is that of a model approximation A model approximation of a category \mathcal{C} with a given class of weak equivalences is a model category \mathcal{M} together with a pair of adjoint functors $\mathcal{M} \rightleftarrows \mathcal{C}$ which satisfy certain properties The key result says that if \mathcal{C} admits a model approximation then so does the functor category $\text{Fun } I, \mathcal{C}$

On the Foundations of Nonlinear Generalized Functions I and II Michael Grosser, 2001 In part 1 of this title the authors construct a diffeomorphism invariant Colombeau type differential algebra canonically containing the space of distributions in the sense of L Schwartz Employing differential calculus in infinite dimensional convenient vector spaces previous attempts in this direction are unified and completed Several classification results are achieved and applications to nonlinear differential equations involving singularities are given

Nearrings and Nearfields Hubert Kiechle, Alexander Kreuzer, Momme Johs Thomsen, 2005-04-19 The present volume is the Proceedings of the 18th International Conference on Nearrings and Nearfields held at the Helmut Schmidt Universit t Universit t der Bundeswehr Hamburg from July 27 August 3 2003 It contains the written versions of the lectures by the five invited speakers These concern recent developments of planar nearrings nearrings of mappings group nearrings and loop nearrings One of them is a long and very substantial research paper The Z Constrained Conjecture They are followed by 13 contributions reflecting the diversity of the subject of nearrings and related structures Besides the purely algebraic structure theory these papers show many connections of nearring theory with group theory combinatorics geometries and topology They all contain original research

Connectivity Properties of Group Actions on Non-Positively Curved Spaces Robert Bieri, Ross Geoghegan, 2003 Generalizing the Bieri Neumann Strebel Renz Invariants this Memoir presents the foundations of a theory of not necessarily discrete actions ρ of a suitable group G by isometries on a proper CAT 0 space M The passage from groups G to group actions ρ implies the introduction of Sigma invariants $\Sigma_k \rho$ to replace the previous $\Sigma_k G$ introduced by those authors Their theory is now seen as a special case of what is studied here so that readers seeking a detailed treatment of their theory will find it included here as a special case We define and study controlled k connectedness CC_k of ρ both over M and over end points e in the boundary at infinity $\partial_\infty M$ $\Sigma_k \rho$ is by definition the set of all e over which the action is $k+1$ connected A central theorem the Boundary Criterion says that $\Sigma_k \rho \subset \partial_\infty M$ if and only if ρ is CC_{k+1} over M An Openness Theorem says that CC_k over M is an open condition on the space of isometric actions ρ of G on M Another Openness Theorem says that $\Sigma_k \rho$ is an open subset of $\partial_\infty M$ with respect to the Tits metric topology When ρ is a discrete group of isometries the property CC_{k+1} is equivalent to $\ker \rho$ having the topological finiteness property type F_{k+1} More generally if the orbits of the action are discrete CC_{k+1} is equivalent to the point stabilizers having type F_{k+1} In particular for $k=2$ we are characterizing finite presentability of kernels and stabilizers Examples discussed include locally rigid actions translation actions on vector spaces especially those by metabelian groups

Strong Boundary Values, Analytic Functionals, and Nonlinear Paley-Wiener Theory Jean-Pierre Rosay, Edgar Lee Stout, 2001 This work is intended for graduate students and research mathematicians interested in functional analysis several complex variables analytic spaces and differential equations

Basic Global Relative Invariants for Homogeneous Linear Differential Equations Roger Chalkley, 2002 Given any fixed integer $m \geq 3$ the author presents simple formulas for $m-2$ algebraically independent polynomials over \mathbb{Q} having the remarkable

property with respect to transformations of homogeneous linear differential equations of order m that each polynomial is both a semi invariant of the first kind with respect to changes of the dependent variable and a semi invariant of the second kind with respect to changes of the independent variable These relative invariants are suitable for global studies in several different contexts and do not require Laguerre Forsyth reductions for their evaluation In contrast all of the general formulas for basic relative invariants that have been proposed by other researchers during the last 113 years are merely local ones that are either much too complicated or require a Laguerre Forsyth reduction for each evaluation

Approximation and Entropy Numbers of Volterra Operators with Application to Brownian Motion Mikhail Anatol'evich Lifshits, Werner Linde, 2002 This text considers a specific Volterra integral operator and investigates its degree of compactness in terms of properties of certain kernel functions In particular under certain optimal integrability conditions the entropy numbers $e_n(T_{\rho, \psi})$ satisfy $\|c_1\|_{\rho, \psi} = 0$

Triangulations of Oriented Matroids Francisco Santos, 2002 We consider the concept of triangulation of an oriented matroid We provide a definition which generalizes the previous ones by Billera Munson and by Anderson and which specializes to the usual notion of triangulation or simplicial fan in the realizable case Then we study the relation existing between triangulations of an oriented matroid M and extensions of its dual M^* via the so called lifting triangulations We show that this duality behaves particularly well in the class of Lawrence matroid polytopes In particular that the extension space conjecture for realizable oriented matroids is equivalent to the restriction to Lawrence polytopes of the Generalized Baues problem for subdivisions of polytopes We finish by showing examples and a characterization of lifting triangulations

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
