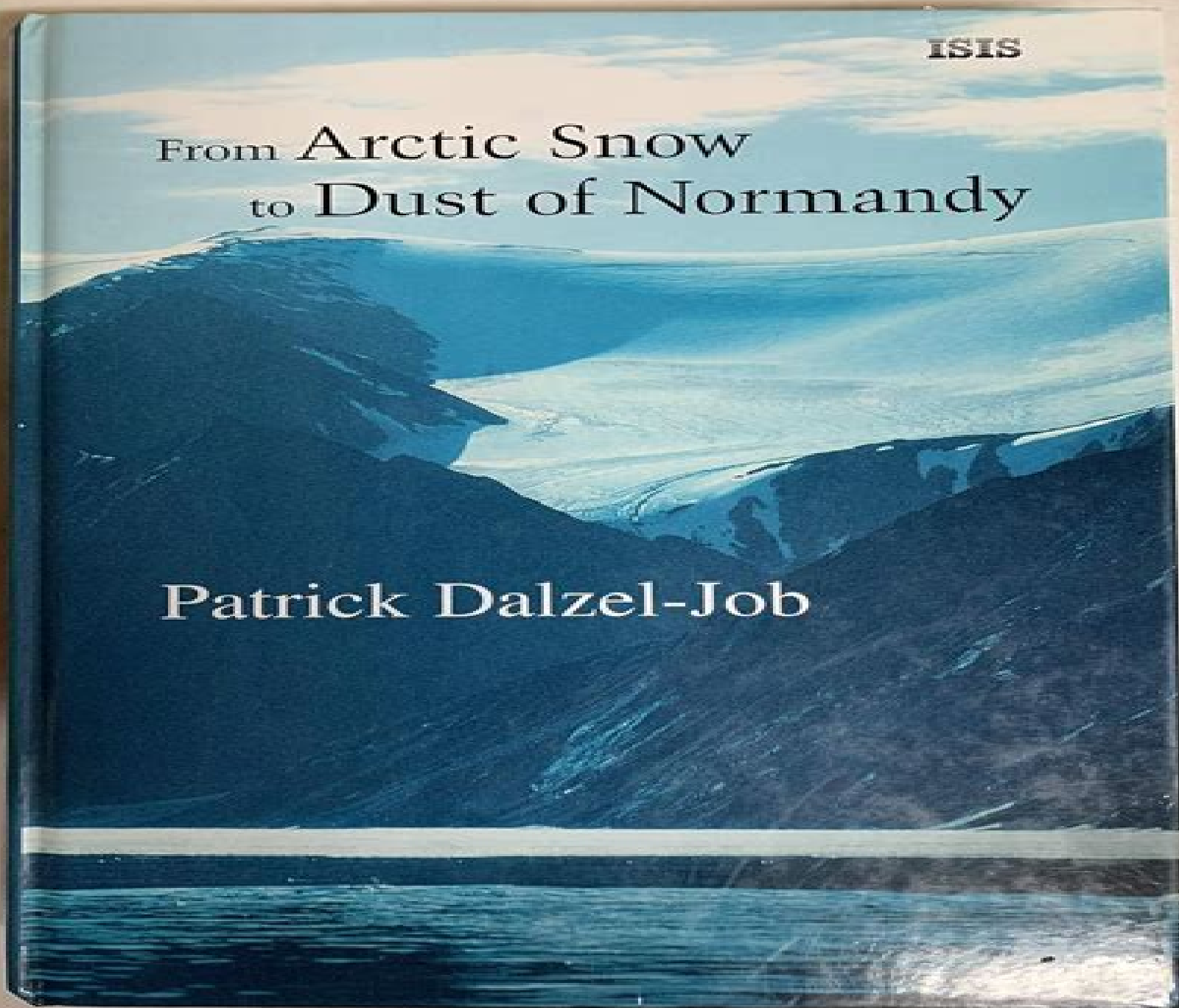

From Arctic Snow to Dust of Normandy Patrick Dalzel-Job, 2001 **Arctic Snow to Dust of Normandy** Patrick Dalzel-Job, 2003-03-19 A memoir from the real life James Bond who could ski backward navigate a midget submarine and undertake the riskiest parachute jumps Wired In 1939 as a young man Patrick Dalzel Job sailed a small brigantine along the Arctic coast of Norway to the Russian border His crew consisted of an aged mother and a blue eyed Norwegian schoolgirl In the following four and a half years of war Patrick had many adventures which he recounts in this charming book His local knowledge and language skills made him invaluable in 1940 and he moved more than 10 000 soldiers of the ill fated Allied North West Expeditionary Force without loss Then acting against specific orders he used his boats to evacuate all the women children and elderly from Narvik just before it was destroyed by German bombers He only escaped a court martial when the King of Norway sent personal thanks to the British Admiralty and presented Patrick with the Knight's Cross of St Olav His later escapades included spells spying on enemy shipping under conditions of great hardship and danger In 1944-45 he commanded a team of Ian Fleming's 30 AU working far in advance of the Allied advance in France and Germany There is strong anecdotal evidence that Fleming based his James Bond character on Patrick As if this were not enough Patrick defied authority to return to Norway in June 1945 and seek out the blue eyed schoolgirl he had had to leave behind After much difficulty he found her now a beautiful young woman and three weeks later married her They lived together in Scotland until her death

Scott others were wealthy such as August Courtauld who returned his pay to help with the war effort but the majority were just ordinary professionals such as publishers lawyers and advertising agents who signed up because they loved sailing Few could ever have dreamed that they would end up acting in areas that were so far beyond their normal lives as they found themselves commanding destroyers and submarines and undertaking covert missions of sabotage Some undertook the dangerous daily drudgery of minesweeping others tackled unexploded bombs engaged the enemy in high speed attacks or played key roles in Ian Fleming s famous intelligence commandos This varied crew of men were given tasks vital to the war effort requiring endurance extraordinary bravery resourcefulness and quick thinking Some died in the process but for the ones who survived Julia asks how their experiences changed them Could their love of sailing and the sea survive the harsh realities of war

The single person probably more responsible than any other for glamorizing the murky world of espionage is Ian Fleming, the creator of James Bond, who himself lived a remarkable double life of spy and writer. Everyone has an opinion on why 007 became so successful, but one possible explanation is the ingenious formula of fact, fiction, and sheer fantasy. Certainly, the author drew on friends and places he knew well to provide the backdrop for his drama, but what proportion of his output is authentic and what comes directly from the author's imagination? These questions and more are examined in the *Historical Dictionary of Ian Fleming's World of Intelligence: Fact and Fiction*. This is done through a chronology, an introduction, a bibliography, and hundreds of cross-referenced dictionary entries on actual cases of espionage, real-life spies, MI5, SIS, CIA, KGB, and others. It also contains entries on Ian Fleming's novels and short stories, family, and friends, his employers and colleagues, and other notable characters.

Hitler's Northern War Adam R. A. Claassen, 2001 Adolf Hitler had high hopes for his conquest of Norway, which held both great symbolic and great strategic value for the Fuhrer. Despite early successes, however, his ambitious northern campaign foundered and ultimately failed. Adam Claassen, for the first time, reveals the full story of this neglected episode and shows how it helped doom the Third Reich. To defeat Hitler, and Raeder, the chief of the German navy, were determined to take and keep Norway. By doing so, they hoped to preempt Allied attempts to outflank Germany, protect sea lanes for German ships, access precious Scandinavian minerals for war production, and provide a launchpad for Luftwaffe and naval operations against Great Britain. Beyond those strategic objectives, Hitler also envisioned Norway as part of a pan-Nordic stronghold, a centerpiece of his new world order. But as Claassen shows, Hitler's grand expectations were never realized. The Luftwaffe was the vital spearhead in the invasion of Norway, which marked a number of wartime firsts. Among other things, it involved the first large-scale aerial operations over sea rather than land, the first time operational objectives and logistical needs were fulfilled by air power, and the first deployment of paratroopers. Although it got off to a promising start, the German effort, particularly against British and Arctic convoys, was greatly hampered by flawed strategic thinking, interservice rivalries between the Luftwaffe and navy, the failure to develop a long-range heavy bomber, the diversion of planes and personnel to shore up the German war effort elsewhere, and the northern theater's harsh climate and terrain. Claassen's study covers every aspect of this ill-fated campaign from the 1940 invasion until war's end and shows how it was eventually relegated to a backwater status as Germany fought to survive in an increasingly unwinnable war. His compelling account sharpens our picture of the German air force and widens our understanding of the Third Reich's way of war.
