**François Boucher and the Art of Collecting in Eighteenth-Century France** Jessica Priebe,2021-11-29 While earlier studies have focused predominantly on artist François Boucher s artistic style and identity this book presents the first full length interdisciplinary study of Boucher s prolific collection of around 13 500 objects including paintings sculpture prints drawings porcelain shells minerals and other imported curios It discusses the types of objects he collected the networks through which he acquired them and their spectacular display in his custom designed studio at the Louvre where he lived and worked for nearly two decades This book explores the role his collection played in the development of his art his studio his friendships and the burgeoning market for luxury goods in mid eighteenth century France In doing so it sheds new light on the relationship between Boucher s artistic and collecting practices which attracted both praise and criticism from period observers The book will appeal to scholars working in art history museum studies and French history **Fragonard** Perrin Stein,Marie-Anne Dupuy-Vachey,Eunice Williams,Kelsey Brosnan,2016 One of the most forward looking artists of the

eighteenth century Jean Honor Fragonard 1732 1806 was a virtuoso draftsman whose works on paper count among the great achievements of his time This book showcases Fragonard s mastery and experimentation in a range of media from vivid red chalk to luminous brown wash as well as etching watercolor and gouache With essays that focus on the role of drawing in his creative process and provide a modern reevaluation of his graphic work the book offers fresh perspectives on this innovative and independent artist who began his career in the Rococo era but lived through and adapted to changing times in France and who chose to leave the more defined path of official patronage in order to work for private clients Unlike many earlier painters who used drawings primarily as preparatory tools Fragonard explored their potential as works of art in their own right ones that permitted him to work with great freedom and allowed his genius to shine The 100 featured works come from New York collections public and private balancing a mix of well loved masterpieces new discoveries and works that have long been out of the public eye Fragonard Drawing Triumphant illuminates the approach of a ceaselessly inventive artist whose draftsmanship was at the core of his remarkable body of work

**Re-Reading the Eighteenth-Century Novel** Jakub Lipski, 2021-08-12 Re Reading the Eighteenth Century Novel adds to the dynamically developing subfield of reception studies within eighteenth century studies Lipski shows how secondary visual and literary texts live their own lives in new contexts while being also attentive to the possible ways in which these new lives may tell us more about the source texts To this end the book offers five case studies of how canonical novels of the eighteenth century by Daniel Defoe Henry Fielding and Laurence Sterne came to be interpreted by readers from different historical moments Lipski prioritises responses that may seem non standard or even disconnected from the original appreciating difference as a gateway to unobvious territories as well as expressing doubts regarding readings that verge on misinterpretative appropriation The material encompasses textual and visual testimonies of reading including book illustration prints and drawings personal documents reviews literary texts and literary criticism The case studies are arranged into three sections visual transvaluations reception in Poland and critical afterlives and are concluded by a discussion of the most recent socio political uses and revisions of eighteenth century fiction in the Age of Trump 2016 2020
