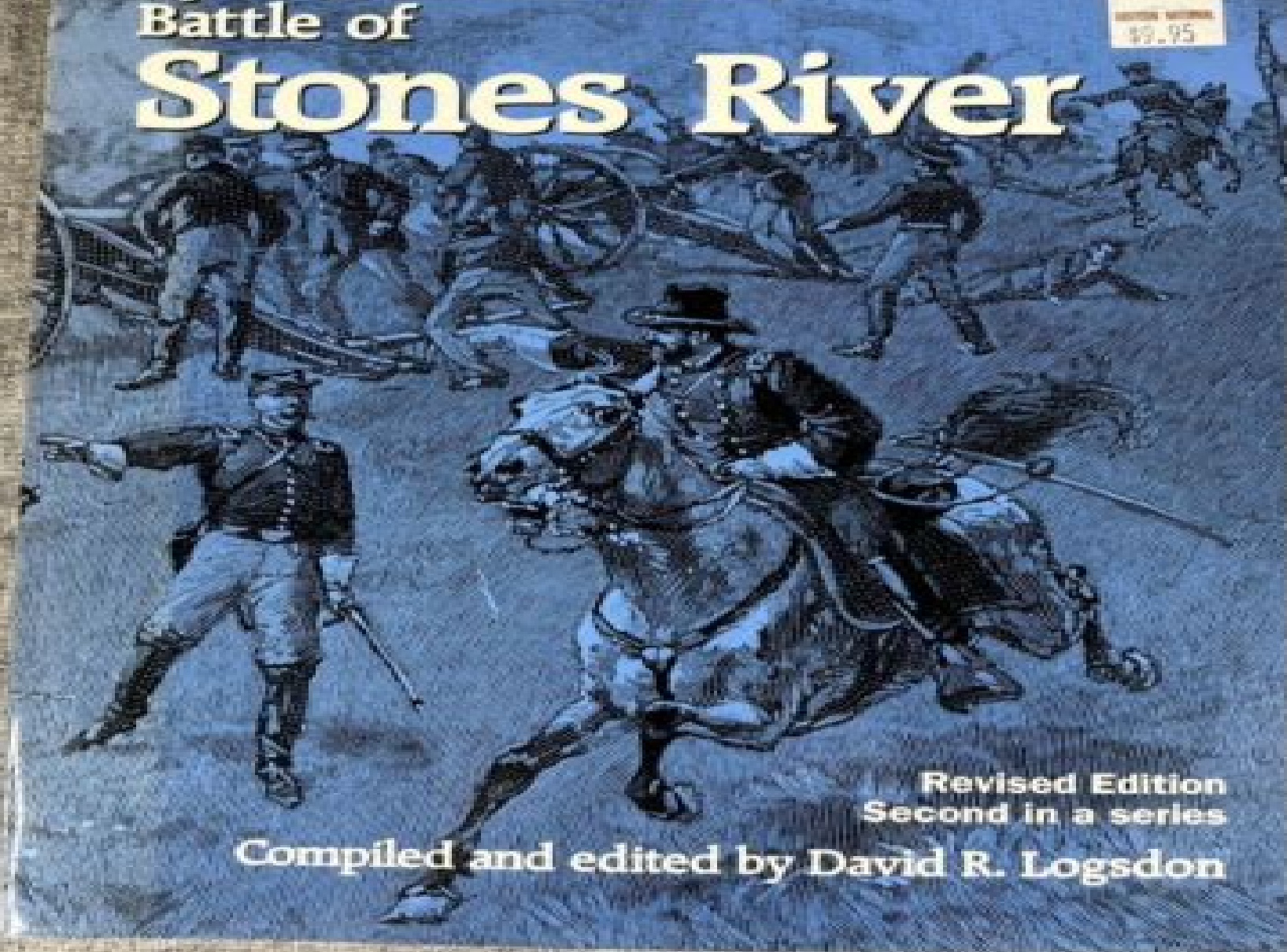

Daniel, 2012-11-05 Three days of savage and bloody fighting between Confederate and Union troops at Stones River in Middle Tennessee ended with nearly 25 000 casualties but no clear victor The staggering number of killed or wounded equaled the losses suffered in the well known Battle of Shiloh Using previously neglected sources Larry J Daniel rescues this important campaign from obscurity The Battle of Stones River fought between December 31 1862 and January 2 1863 was a tactical draw but proved to be a strategic northern victory According to Daniel Union defeats in late 1862 both at Chickasaw Bayou in Mississippi and at Fredericksburg Virginia transformed the clash in Tennessee into a much needed morale booster for the North Daniel s study of the battle s two antagonists William S Rosecrans for the Union Army of the Cumberland and Braxton Bragg for the Confederate Army of Tennessee presents contrasts in leadership and a series of missteps Union soldiers liked Rosecrans s personable nature whereas Bragg acquired a reputation as antisocial and suspicious Rosecrans had won his previous battle at Corinth and Bragg had failed at the recent Kentucky Campaign But despite Rosecrans s apparent advantage both commanders made serious mistakes With only a few hundred yards separating the lines Rosecrans allowed Confederates to surprise and route his right wing Eventually Union pressure forced Bragg to launch a division size attack a disastrous move Neither side could claim victory on the battlefield In the aftermath of the bloody conflict Union commanders and northern newspapers portrayed the stalemate as a victory bolstering confidence in the Lincoln administration and dimming the prospects for the peace wing of the northern Democratic Party In the South the deadlock led to continued bickering in the Confederate western high command and scorn for Braxton Bragg **Eyewitness to the Civil War** Stephen Garrison Hyslop, 2006 Records the military political social and cultural history of the Civil War through photographs artifacts period illustrations maps essays by historians and firsthand accounts **The Battle Rages Higher** Kirk Jenkins, 2010-09-12 The Battle Rages Higher tells for the first time the story of the Fifteenth Kentucky Infantry a hard fighting Union regiment raised largely from Louisville and the Knob Creek valley where Abraham Lincoln lived as a child Although recruited in a slave state where Lincoln received only 0.9 percent of the 1860 presidential vote the men of the Fifteenth Kentucky fought and died for the Union for over three years participating in all the battles of the Atlanta campaign as well as the battles of Perryville Stones River and Chickamauga Using primary research including soldiers letters and diaries hundreds of contemporary newspaper reports official army records and postwar memoirs Kirk C Jenkins vividly brings the Fifteenth Kentucky Infantry to life The book also includes an extensive biographical roster summarizing the service record of each soldier in the thousand member unit Kirk C Jenkins a descendant of the Fifteenth Kentucky s Captain Smith Bayne is a partner in a Chicago law firm [Click here for Kirk Jenkins website and more information about the 15th Kentucky Infantry](#)

Rigdon, 2015-08-21 The men of Battery or Hewitt s Battery were recruited by Capt Hewitt for infantry service but as an artillery company was needed it was drilled for that service and was mustered as such by Gen Thomas October 8 1861 At that early period of the war it was under Gen Thomas and was used in the parts of the state about Somerset Columbia and toward Cumberland river Technically this unit was the Kentucky 3rd Artillery Regiment Company B but it was generally known as an independent Battery The career of this battery was most useful and honorable beginning with Gen Thomas when he was contending with Zollicoffer s forces in Eastern Kentucky it faithfully obeyed every order and bravely discharged every duty it was called upon to perform for full three years of active field service While the Battery was at Murfreesboro the place was attacked by Forrest and a part of the Federal forces was captured At this time Battery B lost two guns The battery fired four hundred and ninety three rounds *Soldier of Tennessee: General Alexander P.
