Rothbard's America's Great Depression is a staple of modern economic literature and crucial for understanding a pivotal event in American and world history. Even so its appearance in 1963 meant that free market advocates had their first full scale treatment of this crucial subject. The damage to the intellectual world inflicted by Keynesian and socialist style treatments would be limited from that day forward.
