Henry David Thoreau's Writing Style

Thoreau is one of those writers that was completely forthcoming with his thoughts and views as they are in his head yet, instead of changing the wording so that the reader will understand, he uses these metaphors to help drive his point home. These metaphors are simple and give a clearer image of what his saying. These metaphors help explain that while his is intelligent, he understand that not every Tom, Dick, and Harry will fully understand. These metaphors also elude to Thoreau being a simple man who seems to really be one with nature.

Thoreau says, "I wanted to live deep and suck out all the marrow of life..." He is saying that he understand what life is and what he doesn't want it to be. Combining that with "I did not wish to live what was not life, living is so dear..." he is not only stating what his intent is but distinguishing it with another example, here it is resignation. He is attempting to compare life as he know it with the life he still has yet to experience, something the complete opposite of what he currently has. He also says, "I went to the woods because I wished to live deliberately, to front only the essential fact of life..." By illustrating the possiblitiy of regret, he shows that there is motive for an individuals identification and symoltaniously, changes an opinion of personal desire into a justified profesion.

It doesn't take long for the reader notices that Thoreau is pairing a simile with each one of his ideas. One would interprate this as a tactic that Thoreau used to help the reader understand what he was thinking, what he was trying to say. It is almost like he was translating his thoughts so that the public at large could understand him. One would have to agree that this is a great way to do this. Not just for the people of this day, but for people to read his work for many years to come. One of the similies he gives here is, "An honest man has hardly need to count more than his ten fingers, or in extreme cases he may add his ten toes, and lump the rest." This particular analogy relates back to his idea that, "Our life is fritted awy by detail." That similie simply emphasized his idea. This approach really grabs the readers attention and connects them to the text.

The reader experiences a rather long metaphor, which is not exactly how Thoreau was executing this piece, and therefore it stands out. One may feel like it just rambles on and takes a lot longer to comprehend what he is trying to say. He uses a lot of rehtoric devices, for example "still live mealy, like ants error upon erro, and clout upon clout..." to slow the pace. As though Thoreu is coming through the page saying, "Reader, it is a busy world out there, and it is a vicious circlce you are caught up in being of the world, please, slow down."

There is also an interesting phrase Thoreau threw in where he says, "starved before we are hungry." This phrase could throw a reader off, to sit a
