In the event of these disasters, the vulnerable people are at risk and are affected more as a majority of them are not able to cope. In developed countries, measures are in place to assist the vulnerable in the event that a disaster strikes. However, Zimbabwe, being a developing country, is not able to deal with unpredictable disasters due to lack of resources; hence the need for it to adopt mitigatory and transformative measures to reduce the impact of any form of disasters.
