Piaget identified four areas of development; the first two cover birth to seven years.

Sensorimotor	0–2 years	Infants learn through sensory experiences, for example, they are often putting objects in their mouth.
Pre-operational	2-7 years	Children learn through 'pretend' play.
Concrete operational	7–11 years	
Formal operational	11-16 years.
