The fracture was clinically insignificant and the patient was discharged home. The patient was followed up with a CT scan of the cervical spine, which showed a fracture of the right lateral mass of the C4 vertebra. A neurosurgery consultation for further surgery was indicated due to the long time that elapsed since her injury. She was referred to physical therapy for her C4 and C5 radiculopathies.
