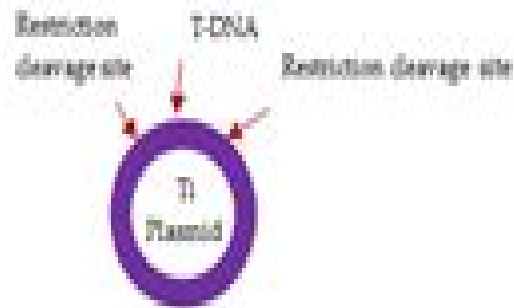
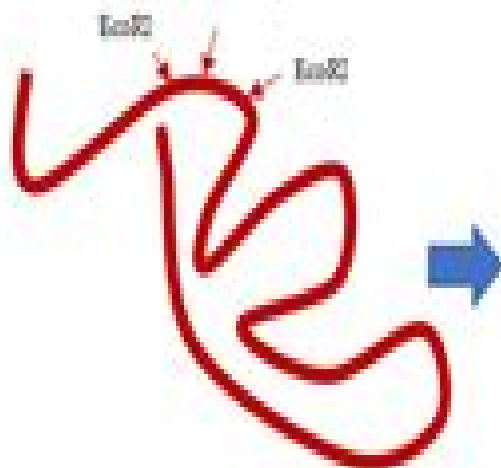

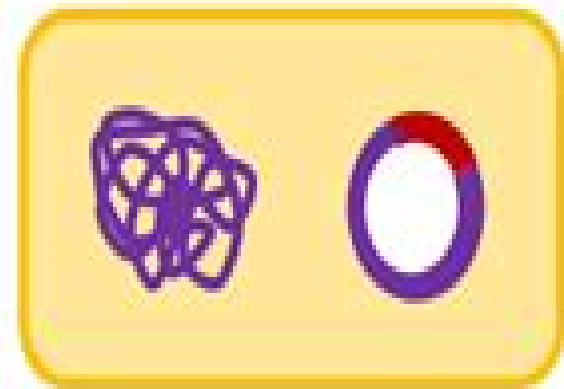


DNA sequence of interest

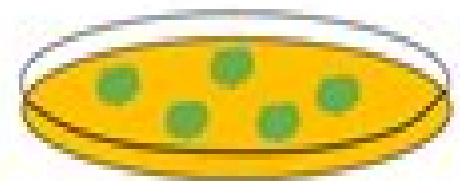

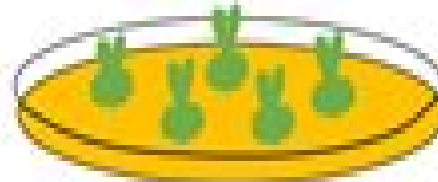
Vector (plasmid) containing DNA of interest
