In the era of globalization since the 1990s international cooperation has become one of the most challenging topics of debate and research in higher education This book attempts to provide scientific evidence on the debates and different types of internationalization found in higher education from a Mexican point of view It identifies German and Mexican partnership collaborations in institutions of higher education as well
