School Food and Nutrition - Global Action Plan 2022-2026 Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations,2022-07-14 The School food and nutrition Global action plan seeks to consolidate and guide FAO s synergistic efforts setting out priority and concrete outputs to be achieved by 2026 Key activities are presented in the plan and organized according to the following action areas 1 promote the uptake of and investment in holistic approaches to school food and nutrition SFN 2 enhance capacities to design implement and monitor effective SFN interventions 3 strengthen policy and legal frameworks that enable SFN implementation and 4 mobilize resources for ensuring regular and better support to countries These have been prioritized based on identified gaps and needs and considering the Organization s technical competence and organizational comparative advantage Such activities are meant to be adapted contextualized and implemented according to regional and national priorities This publication is the result of a collective effort and includes contributions from relevant technical units of FAO across global regional and country levels The development of this plan follows the publication and dissemination of the Organization s School Food and Nutrition Framework and provides the implementation roadmap to attain its expected results *Sub-Saharan Africa: Strengthening resilience to safeguard agricultural livelihoods* Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations,2021-12-22 In 2019 and 2020 alone sub Saharan Africa was hit by a once in a century desert locust upsurge and the COVID 19 pandemic while simultaneously facing conflict droughts and floods among other shocks and stressors More than 60 percent of the population in sub Saharan Africa depends on agriculture for food and income Smallholder farmers pastoralists fishers and foresters are the key change agents in restoring and improving livelihoods in Africa By carrying out interventions that are both anticipatory and reactive tackling the root causes of fragility the challenges facing food security and nutrition can be addressed In the effort to reach Zero Hunger by 2030 the transformation to more efficient inclusive resilient and sustainable agri food systems must be supported for better production better nutrition a better environment and a better life leaving no one behind This publication highlights how FAO is working with partners and governments to strengthen the ability of communities in sub Saharan Africa and food systems to withstand and rapidly recover from crises The organization is contributing to safeguarding the livelihoods of the most vulnerable agro pastoral households in sub Saharan Africa through a range of activities including capacity building knowledge sharing food security and nutrition analyses and anticipatory actions The achievements and interventions presented in this publication are not a comprehensive list of all of FAO s resilience work in the region but rather provide an overview of what is being done to reach our common goal This is made possible through strong partnerships at all levels

Resource partners valuable contributions in particular are critical to these successes By strengthening collaboration with local regional and global partners the persistent challenges related to food crisis contexts are tackled to build back better livelihoods and agri food systems to ensure a positive future for the African people The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Sergio Marchisio, Antonietta Di Blase, 1991 **Exploring the future landscape of new food sources and production systems** Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, Mukherjee, K.; Trieb, J.; Niegowska Conforti, M.; Di Martino, M.; Fattori, V.; Lipp, M., 2025-04-17 Agrifood systems are undergoing significant changes driven by technological advances scientific discoveries and the need to become more sustainable and resilient In response new food sources and production systems NFPS are emerging worldwide with the potential to alter the global food landscape over the next 5 to 25 years The FAO Food Safety Foresight Programme conducted a multi phase foresight exercise to explore potential food safety implications of emerging new food sources and production systems Through expert consultations and a structured methodology combining a two part Delphi survey and mind mapping the exercise identified 44 emerging innovations across nine clusters expected to develop between now and 2050 The exercise revealed both opportunities and challenges associated with the innovations highlighting the need for proactive preparation by food safety authorities and other stakeholders to ensure the safe development and implementation of these innovations while protecting public health Several steps were identified as necessary to achieving this improving communication on the safety implications of NFPS fostering technical advancement for safety assurance developing tailored safety assessments encouraging collaboration between regulators and industry and harmonizing regulatory requirements while maintaining safety standards The findings also highlighted various social technological economic environmental and political issues that must be addressed for the safe integration of these innovations into food systems Continuous monitoring and assessment of emerging NFPS issues is crucial to better understand the long term implications for food safety and public health *Global community meeting of the FAO GM Foods Platform* Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 2020-05-01 In order for Codex Alimentarius Members to share information on the results of Genetically Modified GM food safety assessments the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations FAO maintains an online database entitled FAO GM Foods Platform Upon requests from several Members a global community meeting of the FAO GM Foods Platform was organized from 10 to 13 September 2019 in Bangkok Thailand Ninety nine people from 73 different Platform community members participated in the meeting This report describes the key points of discussions that took place during the three and a half days of the meeting these include but are not limited to clear benefits of data sharing and good practices in the process of sharing and utilizing the shared data While the main purpose of the Platform is to simply share the relevant official data globally the community of the Platform was recognized as a great value providing an opportunity for all focal points of the Platform to be able to directly communicate and learn from each other on technical issues around GM food safety assessments and more importantly to

develop mutual trust among the community members from different countries The Platform itself has become a model for an effective community of practice resulting in many collaborative and successful joint activities including bilateral and multilateral capacity development actions At the end of the meeting participants had the opportunity to network through the World Caf to identify concrete steps for follow up actions at the national and regional level **Proceedings of the FAO**

The right to water for food and agriculture The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 2020-03-01 The right to water emerged in the Nineties primarily as the right to domestic water for drinking washing and cooking and was closely related to the right to sanitation both of which are seen as a component of the right to an adequate standard of living This study examines the question of the right to water for food and agriculture and asks whether such a right can be found in the right to water or whether it is more appropriate to examine the right to adequate food for that purpose Seeking inspiration from the right to adequate food and from other fields of international law the study explores the content of the right to water for food and agriculture and then considers its implications for water law Recognizing a human right to water for drinking and household needs as well as for growing food has implications for water allocation and sets limits to the extent that water can be allocated for other uses In addition it entails the respect for procedural rights and attention to important principles such as the principle of non discrimination and the rights of indigenous peoples

SMALL-SCALE FAMILY FARMING IN THE NEAR EAST AND NORTH AFRICA REGION Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations,2018-08-09 This report provides an overview of a study conducted in the NENA region in 2015 2016 in partnership with FAO CIRAD CIHEAM IAMM and six national teams each of which prepared a national report In the six countries under review in the NENA region Egypt Lebanon Morocco Mauritania Sudan and Tunisia agriculture is carried out primarily by small scale family farmers the majority of whom run the risk of falling into the poverty trap largely due to the continuous fragmentation of inherited landholdings As such the development of small scale family farming can no longer be based solely on intensifying agriculture as the farmers are not able to produce sufficient marketable surplus due to the limited size of their landholdings An approach based strictly on agricultural activity is also insufficient as small scale family farms have already diversified their livelihoods with off farm activities In fact developing small scale farming cannot be achieved by focusing strictly on the dimension of production
