The Fabrication of Aboriginal History: Van Diemen's Land, 1803-1847 Keith Windschuttle, 2003 This is the first volume in a series that re appraises the now widely accepted story about conflict between colonists and Aborigines in Australian history Beginning in Tasmania and eventually covering the whole of the Australian mainland the volumes find that the academic historians of the last thirty years have greatly exaggerated the degree of violence that occurred In a close re examination of the primary sources used by historians Keith Windschuttle concludes that much of their case is poorly founded other parts are seriously mistaken and some of it is outright fabrication.
