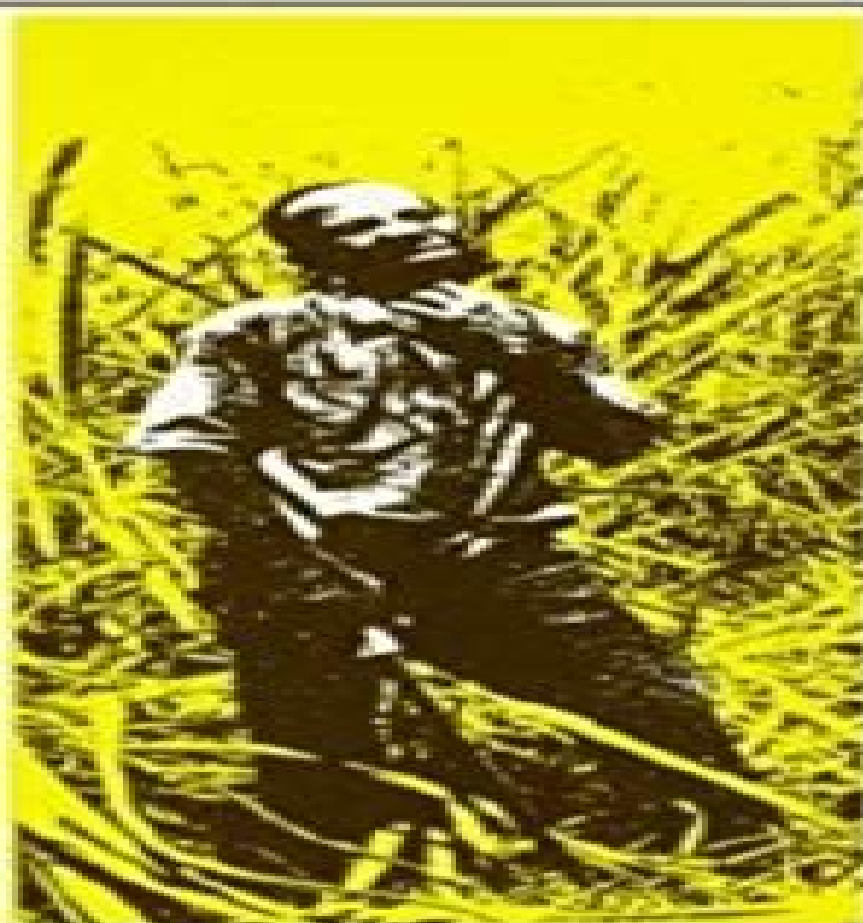
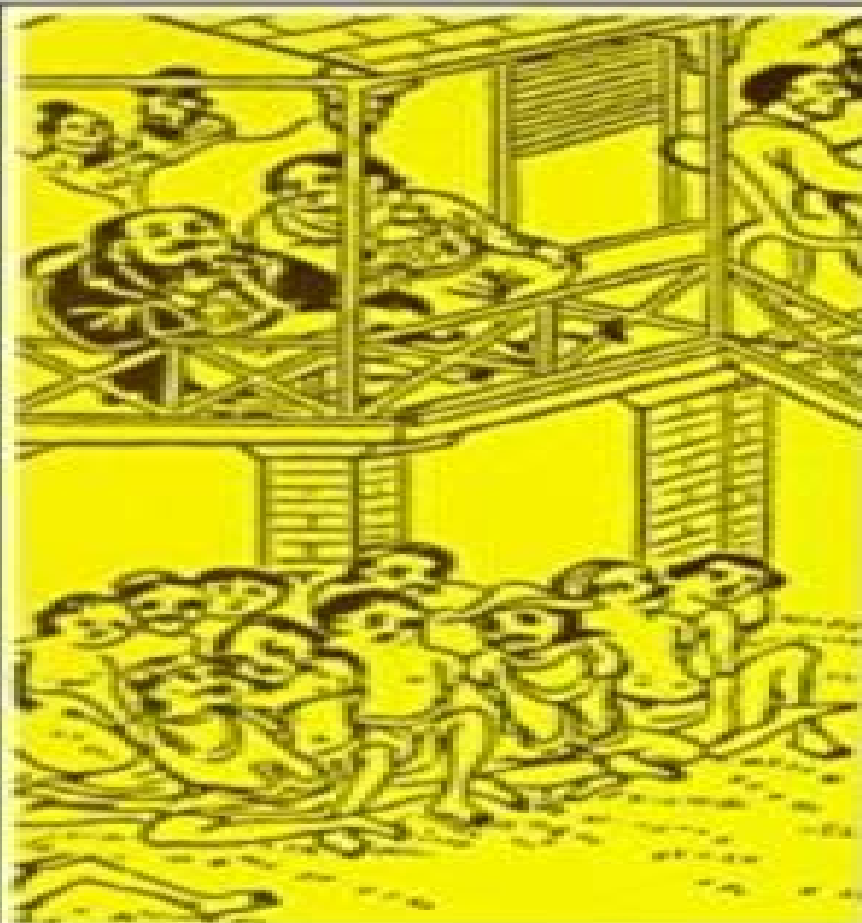

Their stories inform his highly readable narrative of more than two hundred years of American history.
