In early November, Mary was often assured that the business of the partnership would end on New Year's Day as Annah had promised. On 10 November, she received less reassuring information; and 1 January, neither she nor Goodwin would be allowed to use any of the riches accumulating in their trunk, and they would receive no visible treasure from other sources. In spite of the information, Goodwin could not bring himself to advise of the few shillings that Mary could get 'by pawning', or from entering an occasional patient. He had entered into a period of uttering 'beyond expression'.

But while Goodwin suffered from his supposed failures, his natural powers were marvelously augmented by a new method of communicating with God. On 7 December 1685 he was alarmed for the first time, by Gabriel and Michael, that if he lay in passively in his own bed he could expect more divine communication 'by vision or by dream'. He might, in fact, see and hear the Lord Christ.

These instructions, Goodwin knew perfectly well, were already contained in dreams. It was the special mark of the 'true' that he also knew, to receive significant visions, and it was his new prophetic powers that he should receive them. His first attempt, nevertheless, was only partially successful.
