Identity Politics and Ethnic Conflicts in Rwanda and Burundi Godfrey Mwakikagile,2012 This work looks at conflicts between the Hutu and the Tutsi in Rwanda and Burundi The conflicts between the two groups have sometimes been characterised as ethnic although neither group has fundamental attributes of ethnicity or ethnic identity which separate one from the other They have the same culture They speak the same language And they have had a common history during the past 400 years They have intermingled and have intermarried for so long since the Tutsi arrived in the region about 400
