European history has no more persistent or troublesome problem than the telation between the Germans and the Slavs. At a time when these peoples have once more had recourse to arms to settle their differences, objective accounts of the underlying forces and issues are especially valuable. Relations between the Czechs and Germans have been treated by English and American historians, but the Polish-German question has not received adequate attention. In view of this, Dr. Tims' study of the organized efforts of German nationalists between 1894 and 1919 to assert German supremacy in the eastern marches is particularly noteworthy.

The study focuses on the work and program of the "German Eastern Marches Association," or the "H-K-T Society," as it was known after the initials of its three founders, Hansemann, Kennemann, and Tiedemann. These three millionaire farmers provided the leadership for a nationalist society composed mainly of public officials, teachers, Protestant clergymen, and university professors. As the self-proclaimed guardian of the German soul and land the society carried on a tireless, but not especially rewarding campaign, against Polish landowning, language, and commercial or professional practice. Despite the efforts to dramatize the struggle of nationalities in the eastern provinces of the German Empire, the most tangible contribution of the "H-K-T Society" was an embittered state of German-Polish relations that undoubtedly added to the difficulties facing the German and Polish Republics after 1919.

While detail is an exemplary evidence of research effort, it may be questioned whether such a minute analysis of the Polish landowning, language, and school problems might not be replaced by judicious summations. Certainly at least half of the quotations could have been omitted or summarized. An extensive bibliography and copious notes indicate that excellent use has been made of the records and publications of the "German Eastern Marches Association," as well as of newspapers, novels, and periodical literature.
