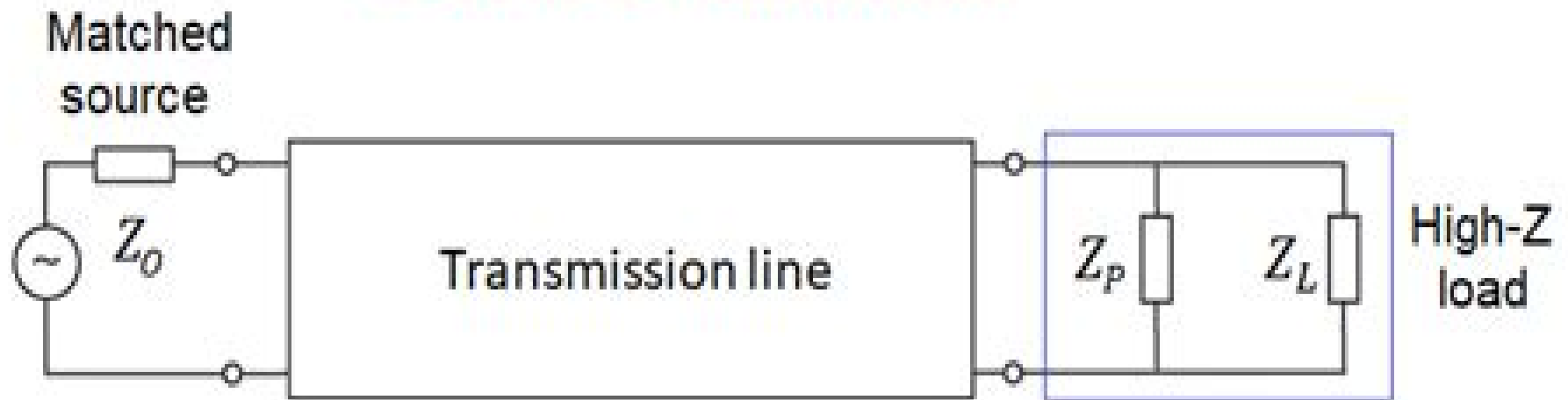

Traditionally, use is made of the TL approximation, which applies to uniform transmission lines with electrically small cross-sectional dimensions where the dominant mode of propagation is TEM. Antenna mode currents and higher order modes appearing at higher frequencies are neglected in TL theory. The use of the TL approximation has permitted to solve a large range of problems, e.g., lightning and EMP interaction with power lines.
