done at age eleven of a poem by Marguerite de Navarre in which the notion of holy incest is the prevailing trope Nor is it coincidental that Mary Wroth author of the first sonnet cycle and prose romance by a woman printed in English described in these an endogamous if not legally incestuous illegitimate relationship with her first cousin Sir Philip Sidney and his sister the Countess of Pembroke translated the psalms together and after his death she finished his work by revising it for publication the two were the subject of rumors of incest Isabella Whitney cast one of her most important long poems as a fictive legacy to her brother arguably because such a relationship resonated with the power of endogamous female agency Elizabeth Carey s closet drama about Mariam the wife of Herod spends important energy on the tie between sister and brother Quilligan also reads male authored meditations on the relationship between incest and female agency and sees a far different Cordelia Britomart and Eve from what traditional scholarship has heretofore envisioned Incest and Agency in Elizabeth s England makes a signal contribution to the conversation about female agency in the early modern period While contemporary anthropological theory deeply informs her understanding of why some Renaissance women writers wrote as they did Quilligan offers an important corrective to modern theorizing that is grounded in the historical texts themselves

Eros and Poetry at the Courts of Mary Queen of Scots and James VI S. marginalized courtier and the absolute sovereign He demonstrates how aristocrats and courtiers such as Sidney Greville Alexander and Cary were able to use the neo Senecan form to consider aspects of their limited political agency under an absolute monarch while others such as Brandon and Daniel respond to similarly marginalized positions within both political and patronage networks In analyzing how these plays illuminate various aspects of early modern political culture this book addresses several gaps in the scholarship of early modern drama and explores new contexts in relation to more familiar writers as well as extending the critical debate to include hitherto neglected authors
