THE U. S. ARMY PLAYED AN IMPORTANT part in our expansion into the Southwest in the nineteenth century. Between the Mexican and Civil wars it was busy developing this region and making it an integral part of the nation. It was actively engaged in establishing military posts, surveying routes for railroads, constructing wagon roads, protecting overland migration and overland mail, surveying boundaries of territories, overawing the Mormons, and fighting hostile Indians. These activities are well portrayed in the letters and journal of Eugene Bandel of the Sixth U. S. Infantry. These documents are here published for the first time.

**Eugene Bandel**, born in Prussia 1835, was an educated and keen observer. He enlisted at Jefferson Barracks, Missouri, 1854. He tramped nearly 6,000 miles over the plains and mountains of the Far West, serving under such prominent officers as Joseph E. Johnston,

The curriculum of the Military Academy, new weapons and armaments development, the activities of the Crimea commission, the Pacific railroad surveys, and the camel expedition all commanded his minute attention. Despite the burdens of office, Davis maintained a lively interest in the issues of the day among them: Latin American filibustering, the purchase of Cuba, states rights, slavery, and the conflict in Kansas. The wide attention accorded his travels and speeches brought national prominence to him, and speculation about his future candidacy for governor, a return to the Senate, the vice presidency, and even the presidency. Personal correspondence includes letters that touch on Davis' long estrangement from his brother, the death of his first child, persistent health problems, and relationships with friends and family. Much of his official correspondence, especially several angry exchanges with army officers, reveals even more about Davis' personality. In addition to the documents published in full, a calendared appendix includes over one hundred recently discovered personal and political items, dates from 1838 through 1852, before Davis' selection as secretary of war.

General Edwin Vose Sumner, USA Thomas K. Tate, 2013-10-01 This biography of General Edwin Vose Sumner emphasizes his role in developing the mounted arm of the U S Army. Born in Boston in 1797, he abandoned a merchant's career and entered the U S Infantry in 1819. Transferring to the Dragoons in the 1830s, Sumner established the Cavalry School of Practice at Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania. Among his students was the future Confederate General Richard S. Ewell. Sumner served with distinction throughout the Mexican War and maintained a balance between the warring factions in Kansas in the mid 1850s, his efforts earning him the displeasure of the Pierce administration. He led an expedition against the Cheyennes with subordinates that included future Civil War generals John Sedgwick and Samuel Sturgis, as well as the capable but headstrong Lieutenant Jeb Stuart. Replacing Albert Sidney Johnston in California in 1861, Sumner kept the state in the Union. Returning east, he commanded the Second Corps throughout 1862 and died of pneumonia in March 1863.
