Franz Schreker, 1878-1934 Christopher Hailey, 1993-03-18 Franz Schreker was the most frequently performed opera composer of his generation His controversial works dominated the central European repertory in the years after the First World War and exercised a major influence on such younger contemporaries as Alban Berg Kurt Weill and Ernst Krenek Forced into retirement by Hitler s racial decrees in 1933 the composer his music banned died a broken man Thereafter Schreker became a forgotten chapter in the history of new music Schreker s music is only now beginning to enjoy a revival This first major biography not only introduces the reader to this important repertory but sets the composer s life and works in the context of his turbulent times Franz Schreker is a dramatic narrative of an artist poised between the intoxicating late Romanticism of fin de siecle Vienna and the sober New Objectivity of Weimar Berlin between a precipitous rise to fame and an equally sudden fall from favor in which aesthetic fashion and political intrigue played their parts Above all the Schreker phenomenon can provide a key to understanding the evolution of musical thought during the problematic years before and after the First World War

Classical and Romantic Performing Practice 1750-1900 Clive Brown, 2004-05-20 The past ten years have seen a

rapidly growing interest in performing and recording Classical and Romantic music with period instruments yet the relationship of composers notation to performing practices during that period has received only sporadic attention from scholars and many aspects of composers intentions have remained uncertain Brown here identifies areas in which musical notation conveyed rather different messages to the musicians for whom it was written than it does to modern performers and seeks to look beyond the notation to understand how composers might have expected to hear their music realized in performance There is ample evidence to demonstrate that in many respects the sound worlds in which Mozart Beethoven Wagner and Brahms created their music were more radically different from ours than is generally assumed
