on death and Arendt's view on natality. As for understanding the aesthetic experience as the paradigmatic experience, Skorin Kapov is informed by Dewey's work on art as experience, Gadamer's work on experience of art, and Jauss's work on the aesthetics of reception and the horizon of expectations. After our sensibility and representational capability are broken, recuperation then leads to sublimity and the subsequent feelings of admiration and responsibility, allowing for the intertwining of aesthetics and ethics. Additionally, elements of Kantian morality, Foucault's ethics, and Kierkegaard's work on interactions between aesthetics and ethics together help to characterize the relation between aesthetics and ethics. Since we often encounter surprise due to unexpectedness in comedy, Skorin Kapov also interprets philosophical views on the comedy and laughter, including Aristotle, Kierkegaard, Meredith, and Bergson, using the theatrical work of Dario Fo as an example. The novel analysis in *The Intertwining of Aesthetics and Ethics* will be of particular interest to students and scholars working or teaching in aesthetics, phenomenology, art history, cultural studies, and ethics.
