Elusive Subjects Susanna Scarparo, 2005-01-01 This book uses a cross cultural and interdisciplinary approach to examine the role of biographies and autobiographies in the construction of historical narratives **Biography across the Digitized Globe**, 2025-02-27 This volume is dedicated to Professor Hans Renders founder of the Biography Institute of the University of Groningen the Netherlands Throughout his academic career Renders witnessed a reflexive turn in historical research biographers became more open about the limitations of their sources and the subjective nature of their selection Over this same period however the availability of digital sources has increased exponentially which has profound implications for biographical research and the transnational framework used to approach the genre Through its thirteen thought provoking essays this work seeks to make an intervention in Biography Studies by bringing the well developed reflexive tradition to bear on the pressing challenge of proliferating digitized sources **Modernity, Sexuality, and Ideology in Iran** Kamran Talattof, 2011-06-01 In Iran since the mid nineteenth century one issue has been a common concern how should Iran become modern More than a century of struggle for or against modernity has constituted much of the social political and cultural history of the country In the decades since the 1979 Revolution the question has become even more critical In *Modernity Sexuality and Ideology in Iran* Talattof finds that the process of modernity never truly unfolded due in large part to Iran's reluctance to embrace the seminal subjects of gender and sexuality Talattof's approach reflects a unique look at modernity as advancement not only in industry and economy but also toward an open intellectual discourse on sexuality Exploring the life and times of Shahrzad a dancer actress filmmaker and poet Talattof illuminates the country's struggle with modernity and the ideological traditional and religious resistance against it Born in 1946 she performed in several theater productions became an acclaimed film star in the 1970s and pursued a career as a journalist and poet Following the revolution she was imprisoned and eventually became homeless on the streets of Tehran Her success and eventual decline as a female artist and entertainer illustrate the conflict between modernity and tradition and Iran's failure to embrace an overt expression of sexuality Talattof also profiles several other female artists of the 1970s analyzing their lives and work as windows through which to examine what Iranian culture allowed and what it repudiated A pioneering and timely work *Modernity Sexuality and Ideology in Iran* explores the integral role of popular culture and female artists in the shaping of modern Iran constructing a new framework for understanding such crucial concepts as ideology and modernity **Offshoot** Donna Lee Brien, Quinn Eades, 2018 *Offshoot* includes essays in life writing methodologies and approaches as well as a series of creative work poetry and prose that engages with current life writing This collection highlights the development and influence of the genre in the twenty first century Starting from the premise that life writing is a significant component of both contemporary artistic practice and scholarship *Offshoot* provides a necessary re evaluation of the mode its contemporary sub generic incarnations as well as methodological and practical approaches The book presents research on a

Late-Victorian Heroic Lives in the Writings of Frank Mundell Moniez Baptiste, 2017-08-21 This study explores the work of Frank Mundell a late Victorian author for the Sunday School Union Mundell focused on heroism and represented various kinds of heroic deeds and figures regardless of gender in his books Writing for educative as well as entertaining purposes he avoided the use of didacticism and he endeavoured to combine the traditional and the modern in the stories he chose to tell Mundell s favourite format was that of the prosopography putting together several heroic lives or incidents He was careful to dedicate each of his volumes to one topic in particular thus distinguishing the different types of heroic deeds from one another His writings belong to four series or collections each highlighting a specific version of heroism from instances of the mundane performed in a familial context to extraordinary deeds He wrote about such bold acts as those featuring in the stories of brave firemen fighting devouring flames fearless sailors in tempestuous seas determined miners risking their lives to save their comrades or intrepid explorers facing perils in the wide world This book analyses each of his publications highlighting the elements belonging to his representation of heroism as a whole

which has its roots in the life threatening conditions she experienced as a small child in a WWII Japanese concentration camp is enacted in a narrative re building and re constructing of personal memory of various personal social and political histories of motherhood and maternal discourses of crime stories of postmodern fragmentation and even of the process of erasure itself Maraini s narrative is deeply attentive to the mechanisms that threaten survival of the body and not just the woman s body psychological and aesthetic survival the survival in the Italian canon of a woman author s work memory and legacy after her death the survival of a drug addicted and self destructive younger generation and by extension collective and ecological survival Never marked by nihilism or despair Maraini s narratives offer the ethos of reconstruction as a variation on the begin again that marks the end of many of her novels and as we can see in Colomba her own aesthetic process of renewal and regeneration This book focuses primarily on *Il treno per Helsinki* 1984 *Isolina* 1985 some of her short stories for children *La nave per Kobe* *Diari giapponesi di mia madre* 2001 *Buio Strega Literary Prize* 1999 and *Colomba* 2004 Writing and Performing Female Identity in Italian Culture Virginia Picchietti, Laura A.
