

ACUTE MANAGEMENT: SICKLE CELL CRISIS

General principles:

- Hydration
- Oxygenation
- Prompt & adequate analgesia
- Early treatment of infection
- Identification and treatment of complications

Hydration

AIM: prevent dehydration

- Start hyper-hydration at 150% maintenance (can be given PO/NG/IV)
- Strict input-output monitoring

Oxygen

AIM: sats >95%

- Administer high flow oxygen if sats < 95%

RED FLAGS

- Chest pain
- Sats < 95%
- ↑ oxygen requirement
- Fever > 38°C
- ↑ work of breathing

Analgesia

- Start within 30 minutes of arrival
- If severe - give IV/IN morphine
- Consider PCA/NCA to control pain
- Remember paracetamol + NSAIDs
- Don't forget antiemetics & laxatives
