

Figure 1.10: A 2D plot of a function of two variables, $f(x, y)$, showing a surface over a domain in the xy -plane.

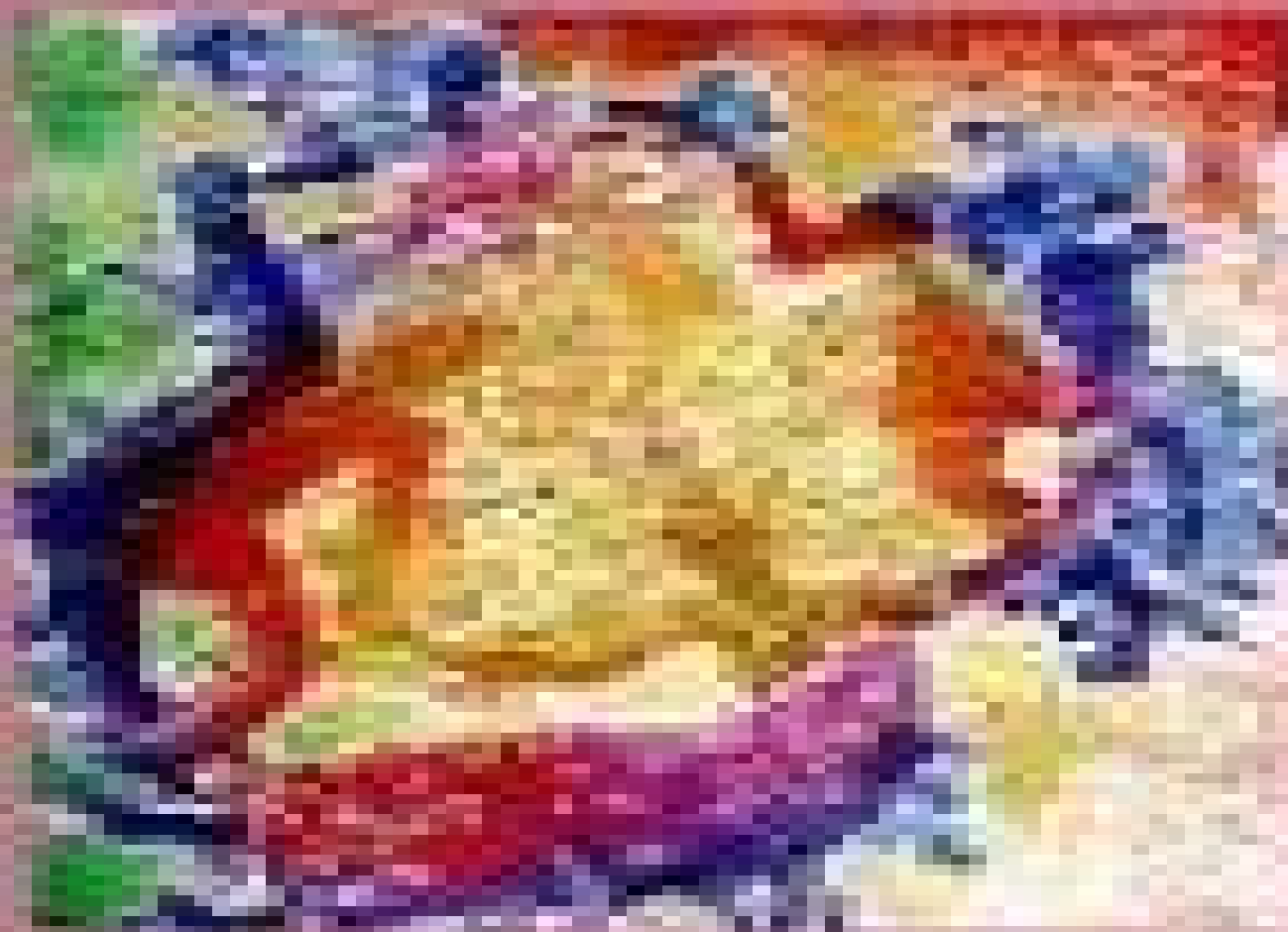


Figure 1.11: A 2D plot of a function of two variables, $f(x, y)$, showing a surface over a domain in the xy -plane.
