

## Author-to-Reader and Reader-to-Author methods

Schleiermacher proposes two possibilities to bring **writer and his reader closer** – without forcing reader to leave bounds of his own native tongue behind him, to acquire as correct and complete an understanding and take as much pleasure in the writer as possible:

1. **Reader-to-Author** : the translator leaves the writer in peace as much as possible moves the reader towards him. (**Foreignization**)

2. **Author-to-Reader** :the translator leaves the reader in peace as much as possible and moves the writer towards him.(**Domestication**)
