The public must read and learn about fashion and clothes, not just look at photos of glamorous people or read articles usually written by good writers but without substance, but read articles to acquire knowledge about clothes and properly wearing those that depict fashion and artistic dressing. This perception stigmatized the sewing trade as the trade of the dropouts and thus caused the younger generation to turn away from learning the trade. With the same breath, they can restore the artistic talent through a concerted effort of the authorities, the fashion schools, and the manufacturers before the art disappears completely.
