battles in Hong Kong to how young Asian women have been influenced by the social media campaigns to encourage wearing the veil in Indonesia to Asian women negotiating femininity in political dress Primary readership will be among researchers scholars educators and students in the fields of fashion dress studies women and gender studies and media and history It will be of particular value as at graduate level and as a supplementary resource There may be some general appeal to those with an interest in the women or cultures at the centre of the discussions
