El teatro en España, entre la tradición y la vanguardia 1918/1939

De un tiempo a esta parte se han publicado dos libros a cual más significativo, cuya pretensión es la de

rescatar del olvido al teatro español que se produjo desde principios de siglo hasta la guerra civil.

El primero de ellos, que abarca de 1918 a 1926, es el resultado de las investigaciones realizadas por Dra Dougherty y María Francisca Vilches y, con él, a través de una preciosa documentación y su correspondiente análisis, se restablece la memoria perdida de lo que fue el teatro en la escena madrileña de ese período.

No obstante, el libro que va a merecer la atención de esta nota es el que encabeza el título, el cual ha sido coordinado y editado también por Dra Dougherty y María Francisca Vilches, con el patrocinio del Consejo Superior de Investigaciones Científicas, la Fundación Federico García Lorca y Tabacalera S.A.

Por medio de la sistemática edición de 49 ponencias de otros tantos profesores, nacionales y extranjeros, presentadas a un seminario que, sobre el teatro español de entreguerras, tuvo lugar a comienzos de 1992, se plantea el estado de la cuestión del teatro por aquella época, procediéndose a la investigación crítica e histórica de distintas dramaturgias, así como de la dirección escénica y aparato teatral, propuestas de reforma y realizaciones de algunos de los movimientos escénicos más progresivos surgidos en ese tiempo. Todo ello, además, complementado con una riquísima bibliografía, lo que hace de este libro pieza imprescindible, diversa y globalizadora para tratar de entender en toda su profundidad lo que significó el teatro español en el período abordado. Un teatro —dicho quede por adelantado— que, a pesar de sus muchas deficiencias y pecados, dio muestras de una vitalidad social asombrosa, sabiendo atraer y atrapar la pasión de los públicos.

En el seminario mentado, origen de la edición de este libro, se procedió a analizar el panorama de ese teatro, concebido en su expresión total (es decir, autores, actores, directores, puestas en escena y recepción por parte de la crítica y el público), víctima de sus obligadas tensiones entre la tradición y la vanguardia, y de situar en aquel caldo de cultivo las dramaturgias de Valle-Inclán y García Lorca, así como otras producidas por la generación del 98 y la del 27, las cuales, como es bien sabido, no obtuvieron el total beneplácito de los espectadores. Hasta tal punto fue así que las obras de Valle-Inclán y García Lorca, sin duda las más estudiadas en este «corpus»,

Richter, 2014-10-15 García Lorca at the Edge of Surrealism The Aesthetics of Anguish examines the variations of surrealism and surrealist theories in the Spanish context studied through the poetry drama and drawings of Federico García Lorca 1898 1936 In contrast to the idealist and subconscious tenets espoused by surrealist leader André Breton which focus on the marvelous automatic creative processes and sublimated depictions of reality Lorca's surrealist impulse follows a trajectory more in line with the theories of French intellectuals such as Georges Bataille 1897 1962 who was expelled from Breton's authoritative group Bataille critiques the lofty goals and ideals of Bretonian surrealism in the pages of the cultural and anthropological review Documents 1929 1930 in terms of a dissident surrealist ethnopoetics This brand of the surreal underscores the prevalence of the bleak or darker aspects of reality crisis primitive sacrifice the death drive and the violent representation of existence portrayed through formless base matter such as blood excrement and fragmented bodies The present study demonstrates that Bataille's theoretical and poetic expositions including those dealing withInforme the formless and the somber emptiness of the void engage the trauma and anxiety of surrealist expression in

the pervasive role of undecidability in *Amor de don Perlimplín* two further contextual chapters cover what Anderson considers the most significant factors that encouraged Lorca to continue experimenting in his dramatical works namely his exposure to theater in New York over 1929-1930 and his increasing familiarity with expressionist drama that he both read and heard about from other theater professionals From there El público and As que pasen cinco años each receive two chapters devoted to their themes and symbols and the book ends with a final chapter on how audiences could experience a staging of El sueño de la vida By synthesizing materials drawn from theatrical practice artistic modernism and the historical avant garde Lorca's Experimental Theater gives an integrated picture of this corpus by providing detailed readings of the plays surveying their textual and performative history and examining the most important contemporary influences on Lorca's creation of these expressive innovative works
