emphasis on proper Sunday observance is a result of the Reformed church authorities attempting to maintain the pious reputation of the Reformed faith and establish the identity of the Reformed Church amid multiple other confessional identities Second proper observance of the Sabbath was important because it ensured order within the church and society more broadly
