the exact course of the battle One of his first observations is that the fight took place along the Little Horn River its junction with the Big Horn was several miles away so the term for the battle Little Big Horn has always been a misnomer He precisely traces the mysterious activities of Benteen's battalion on that fateful day and why it couldn't come to Custer's reinforcement He describes Reno's desperate fight in unprecedented depth as well as how that unnerved officer benefited from the unexpected heroism of many of his men Indian accounts ever present throughout this book come to the fore especially during Custer's part of the fight because no white soldier survived it However analysis of the forensic evidence like tracking cartridges and bullets discovered on the battlefield plus the locations of bodies assist in drawing an accurate scenario of how the final scene unfolded It may indeed be clearer now than it was to the doomed 7th Cavalrymen at the time who through the dust and smoke and Indians seeming to rise by hundreds from the ground only gradually realized the extent of the disaster Of additional interest is the narrative of the battlefield after the fight when successive burial teams had to be dispatched for the gruesome task because prior ones invariably did a poor job Though the author is no longer with us his daughter Tori Harper along with historians Gordon Richard and Monte Akers have done yeoman's work in preserving his valuable research for the public Having read and studied several previous books on the Custer Battle I was hoping that something new would emerge and I was not disappointed certainly a book that one cannot put down Norman Franks author of Ton Up Lancs and Washita Jerome A. Widowed Ones Chris Enss, Howard Kazanjian, 2022-06-15 There weren t many women in the late 1800s who had the opportunity to accompany their husbands on adventures that were so exciting they seemed fictitious Such was the case for the women married to the officers in General George Armstrong Custer's Seventh Cavalry There were seven officers wives They were all good friends who traveled from post to post with one another along with their spouses Of the seven widows Elizabeth Custer was the most well known As the wife of the commanding officer Libbie felt it was her duty to be present when the officer's wives at Fort Lincoln were told their husbands had been killed at the Battle of the Little Bighorn The women were overwhelmed with letters of condolence Most people were sincere in their expressions of sorrow over the widows loss Others were ghoulish souvenir hunters requesting articles of their husbands clothing and personal weapons as keepsakes The press was preoccupied with how the wives of the deceased officers were handling their grief During the first year after the tragic event reporters sought them out to learn how they were coping what plans they had for the future and what if anything they knew about the battle itself The widows were able to soldier through the scrutiny because they had one another They confided in each other cried without apologizing and discussed their desperate financial situations The friendship the bereaved widows had with one another proved to be a critical source of support The transition from being officers wives living at various forts on the wild frontier to being single women with homes of their own was a difficult adjustment Without one another to depend upon the time might have been more of a struggle The Widowed Ones Beyond the Battle of the Little Bighorn tells the stories of these women and the unique bond they shared through never before seen materials from the Elizabeth Custer Library and Museum at Garryowen Montana including letters to and from politicians and military leaders to the widows fellow soldiers and critics of George Custer to the widows and letters between the widows themselves about when the women first met the men they married and their attempts to persevere after the tragedy

yet self destructive a romantic individualist at odds with the institution of the military court martialed twice in six years and the new corporate economy a wartime emancipator who rejected racial equality Stiles argues that although Custer was justly noted for his exploits on the western frontier he also played a central role as both a wide ranging participant and polarizing public figure in his extraordinary transformational time a time of civil war emancipation brutality toward Native Americans and finally the Industrial Revolution even as he became one of its casualties Intimate dramatic and provocative this biography captures the larger story of the changing nation It casts surprising new light on one of the best known figures of American history a subject of seemingly endless fascination **The Papers of Andrew Johnson** Andrew Johnson, 1967 Is there life after the presidency That is the question with which Andrew Johnson wrestled after his return to Tennessee in March 1869 until his death in the summer of 1875 He answered that question with a resounding yes and revitalized his political ambitions For his six post presidential years Johnson relentlessly pursued a vindication of earlier setbacks and embarrassments He had hardly arrived back in Greenville before he began mapping his strategy to recapture public acclaim Johnson eschewed the opportunity to compete for the governor's chair and opted instead to set his sights on the prospects of going back to the nation's capital preferably as a U S senator Johnson engaged in three separate campaigns one in 1869 one in 1872 and the final one is 1874 75 In the first he sought election to the U S Senate At the very last minute the tide went against him in the legislature and Johnson thereby lost a wonderful opportunity to return to Washington only a few months after the end of his presidency In 1872 Tennessee stipulated that its new congressional seat would be an at large one This suited Johnson who favored a statewide rather than a district race When he could not secure the formal nomination of the state's Democratic part he boldly declared himself an independent candidate Although he knew full well that his actual chances of election over either a Republican or a Democratic rival were slim Johnson stayed in the fray Confederates exerted one the Democratic party and he succeeded The Republican contender emerged victorious much as Johnson had calculated and therefore in a somewhat perverse this strengthened Johnson's political clout for another day The day came in 1874 when he launched his campaign for the U S Senate Johnson labored mightily throughout the state in this cause by the time the legislature convened he was the major contender for the post But Democratic party successes in the gubernatorial and legislative elections had encouraged a number of other hopefuls Eventually the legislature staged fifty five ballots before Johnson carried the day in late January 1875 As fate would have it President Grant summoned a special session if the U S Senate to meet in March enabling Johnson to claim his seat well ahead of the normal schedule The ex president strode confidently into the Senate chamber the scene of his impeachment embarrassment in 1868 and took the oath of office Many well wishers as well as old foes greeted the battle scarred political veteran whose vindication had been achieved at last After lingering in Washington after the close of the Senate session Johnson returned to Tennessee where he lived out the short remainder of his days With the exception of serious financial reverses and a nearly fatal battle with cholera in 1873 Johnson s sole focus had been his political rehabilitation Considering his return to the Senate albeit brief the argument could be made that he succeeded But considering the verdict of most historians it remains debatable whether he achieved his aims The Editor Paul H Bergeron is professor of history at the University of Tennessee Knoxville
