Ecrire En Creole Oralite Et Ecriture Aux Antilles:

Ecrire en créole, 1993-12-20 Dans cet ouvrage qui fait la synthèse de travaux se tendant sur une dizaine d'années l'auteur analyse précisément la situation du créole et son rapport avec l'écrit dans les Petites Antilles. L'idée principale défendue ici est que l'écriture d'une langue marquée par l'oralité n'est possible qu'à travers une série d'opérations et d'interventions qui peuvent se tendre sur des siècles et qui sont ici envisagées de façon complète. Il ne s'agit pas seulement de doter le créole d'une orthographe mais de faire de cette langue souvent minorée une langue part entière c'est-à-dire susceptible de fonctionner hors situation et de transmettre l'information avec une redondance linguistique suffisante pour que la communication soit efficace en l'absence physique du récepteur du message. Sont aussi successivement examinées diverses questions telles que celles qui se posent lors de l'adoption d'un système graphique, celle des attitudes des locuteurs confrontés aux propositions d'orthographe, les phénomènes intonatifs et leurs représentations ou transformations lors du passage à l'écriture, les questions concernant l'utilisation et le développement du lexique, quelques aspects morphosyntaxiques et notamment l'utilisation publicitaire du créole, enfin la conquête du statut de langue littéraire et ses difficultés en fonction des différents genres poésies, théâtre, roman.

It will be of a great interest to many others as well, including those who study language politics and language planning in general, language revival and Caribbean literature of French expression.

The Francophone Caribbean Today Gertrud Aub-Buscher, Beverley Ormerod Noakes, 2003. The essays in this volume consider various literary and linguistic aspects of the francophone Caribbean at the beginning of the twenty-first century, focusing particularly on the French Overseas Departments of Martinique and Guadeloupe and the independent islands of Haiti and Dominica. The literary chapters are devoted to new voices in the region and the Caribbean diaspora or to recent works by established authors. Contributors offer fresh interpretations of Caribbean literary movements and explore relevant nonliterary issues such as socio-political developments which have influenced the writers of today. The linguistic chapters examine the dynamics of the respective roles of Creole and the European standard language and consider the present viability of Creole as a literary medium.

Francophone Cultures and Geographies of Identity Zsuzsanna Fagyal, H. Adlai Murdoch, 2014-07-03. This collection of original essays challenges French-centered conceptions of francophonie as the shaping force of the production and study of the French language, literature, culture, film, and art, both inside and outside mainland France. The traditional view of francophone cultural productions as offshoots of their hexagonal avatar is replaced by a pluricentric conception that reads interrelated aspects of francophonie as products of specific contexts, conditions, and local ecologies that emerged from post-colonial encounters with France and other colonizing powers. The twenty-one papers, grouped into six thematic parts, focus on distinctive literary, linguistic, musical, cinematographic, and visual forms of expression in geographical areas long defined as the peripheries of the French-speaking world: the Caribbean, the Indian Ocean, the Maghreb, sub-Saharan Africa, Quebec, and hexagonal cities with a preponderance of immigrant populations. These contested sites of French collective identity offer a rich formulation of distinctly local francophone identities that do not fit in with concepts of linguistic and ethnic exclusiveness but are consistent with a pluralistic demographic shift and the true face of Frenchness that is indeed plural.

Sprache und Identität einer postkolonialen Gesellschaft im Zeitalter der Globalisierung Ursula Reutner, 2025-05-15 Kreolsprachen finden ein verstärktes Interesse der Linguisten nicht zuletzt weil sie Sprachdaten von großem Wert bereitstellen. Die 1981 von Annegret Boll gegründete Kreolische Bibliothek hat es sich zur Aufgabe gemacht durch Texteditionen Grammatiken und Wörterbücher die Kreolsprachen für die linguistische Forschung zu erschließen. Die Entstehung der Kreolsprachen aus dem Zusammentreffen unterschiedlicher Kulturen im Kontext der Sklaverei gibt ihnen eine Sonderstellung unter den Regionalsprachen Frankreichs.
