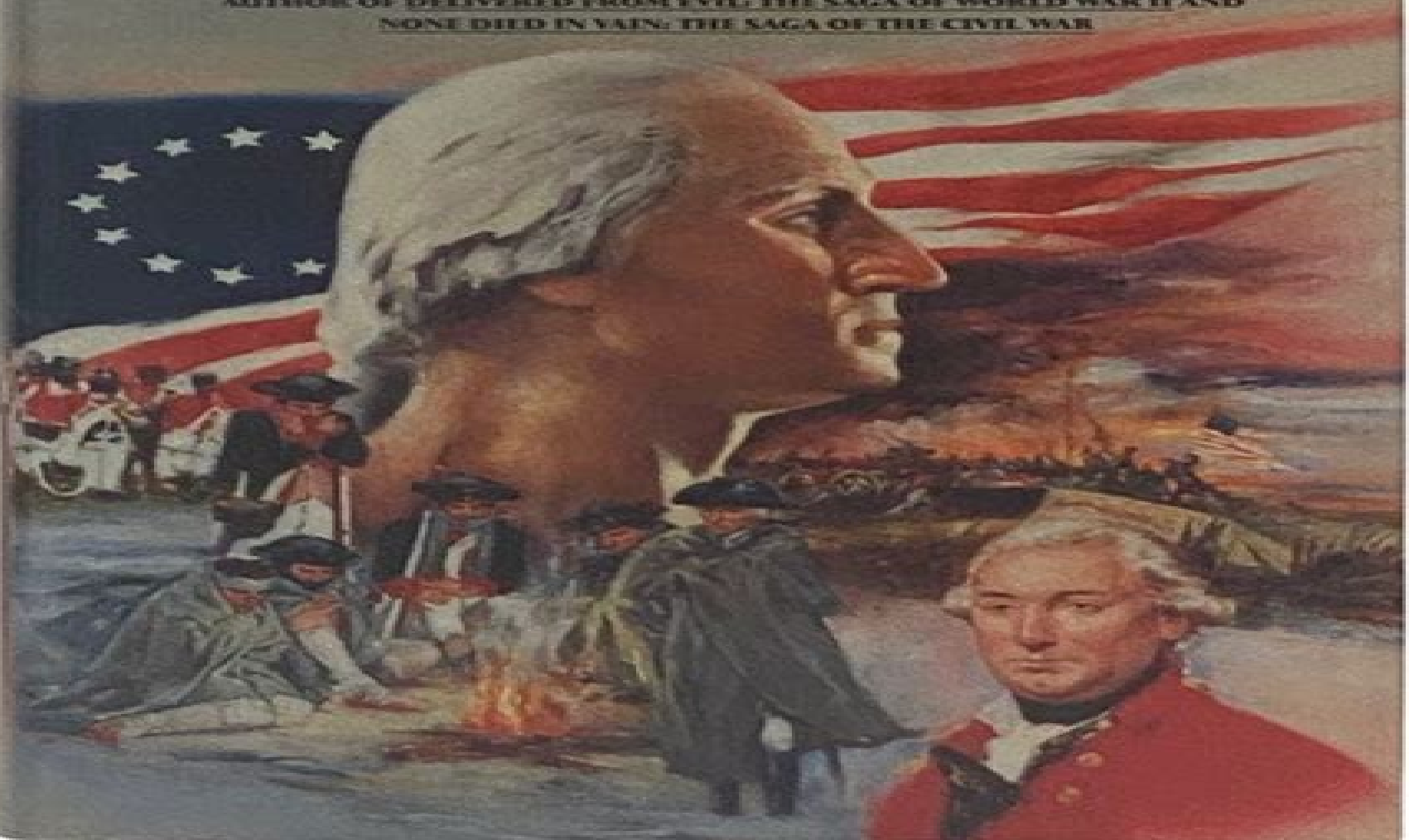

because of his early death in 1786 when he was just forty three But with Tucker s brief but masterful biography Greene finally gets his due
