On a load line length of 16 lft-6in, the speed-length ratio works out at .98 for 12% knots, but to attain a high ratio of 1.25 a speed of 15.98 knots would have been required.

On a later Atlantic passage she stood by the sinking steamer San Francisco for a week and rescued over 200 passengers, a feat which was immortalised by Walt Whitman."
