Days Lilah Grace Canevaro, 2015-04-16 Greek poet Hesiod's canonical archaic text, the *Works and Days*, was performed in its entirety but was also relentlessly excerpted, quoted, and reapplied. In this volume, Lilah Grace Canevaro situates the poem within these two modes of reading and argues that the text itself, through Hesiod's complex mechanism of rendering elements detachable while tethering them to their context for the purposes of the poem, sustains both treatments. One of the

poem's difficulties is that Hesiod gives remarkably little advice on how to negotiate these different modes of reading.
